5. Curriculum and courses

- **Duration:** The B. Arch program is a minimum of 5 academic years, including practical training.
- **Course structure:** The curriculum follows guideline based on the Choice Based Credit System, covering professional core courses, building science, and elective courses.
- **Teaching methods:** Methods include lecture, studios, workshop, and internship.
- **Study Tours**: Annual study tours are an integral part of the curriculum.
- These regulations aim to ensure a high standard of architectural education across institution in India.

6. Infrastructure and physical facilities

Building out Architectural institution has an individual building with sufficient floors area approximately 15 square meters per student, and is included with spacious classrooms, studios, faculty areas, full-fledged library, workshop, laboratories, and administrative offices.

- 1. Barrier- Free environment: the building and premises is very much accessible to students with disabilities which incorporates ramps. And winders doorways as needed.
- 2. Land: Our institute offers a Bachelor of Architecture (B. Arch) program which need a minimum of 8000 sq. m. pf land, with built floor space varying based on student's intake.
- 3. Additional facilities (desirable): provision on shared bases includes a canteen, tuck shop, reprography section, open air theatre, permanent exhibition space, and provision for outdoor sports.

7. Learning resources

Library: Our grand library full-fledges the minimum number of books and titles depending on the student intake and year of operation, with ongoing acquisition of new books and titles annually. It also involves a subscription of a specific number of referred journals. The library is managed by a professionally qualified staff.

8. Workshop and Laboratories:

Mandatory workshops include model making and we preferred carpentry as students can visualize architectural joineries and many work. Recommended but provided laboratories cover areas such as Climatology, Surveying, and Material Testing. These facilities are also managed by qualified staff and equipped to meet curriculum requirements.

Computers with licensed software and broadband internet connectivity. Hardware and software are upgraded Computer Centre: Our campus has an adequate computing resource, including regularly.

9. Audio visual Equipment's

Sufficient audio-visual equipment and digital aids are available.

10. Faculty

A teacher/student ratio of 1: 10 is available which includes core. Allied, and visiting faculty. There are specific requirements for the minimum number of full-time faculty members based on student intake. Faculty is registered with the COA and meet qualification criteria. The COA is involved in faculty selection, and new faculty must undergo training.
